Emergency Services - is a program to help immigrants pay for serious health care emergencies. This program is for children 0-18 years old, adults 65 or older, adults with disabilities, and adults caring for children.

To get your medical bill paid for by Emergency Services, you must have **ALL** of these:

	A medical	emergency

To apply:

1. Call 1-800-362-3002. Ask for the phone number and address of the agency in your area where you can apply for Medicaid.

2. Apply with the agency in person or by phone.

Emergency
Services pays for care **after** you get a bill.



Always call 9-1-1 or go to the Emergency Room in an emergency.

You **do not need** a social security number (SSN) to apply.

Your information will not be shared with INS (Immigration services) or ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement).

If you don't qualify for Emergency Services, call the hospital or clinic.

Ask about options to lower the bill.

Go to a free clinic or community health center

To find a clinic near you, **call 2-1-1**. Free clinics help people for free. Community Health Centers have financial help to lower the bill.

Prenatal Services for Pregnant Women

Pays for baby's birth and your health care while you are pregnant.



To qualify you must have **ALL** of the following:

- You are pregnant
- Household salary or income before taxes at or less than the number in the chart
